## National Under 23s Gone! to the Korfball U23 World **Championships in Barcelona, Spain**

The team left Adelaide on Wednesday 3rd October flying to Amsterdam. They will spend a week in The Netherlands preparing and acclimatising with our host club

KV Wageningen. During our stay there the team will play 4 matches and train daily. The players will be billeted out with host families and given a bicycle to get to and from korfball!

KV Wageningen is the formation out of the merger between SKV, VADA and SSS clubs. With about 600 members, 26 youth teams and 12 senior it is one of the top ten clubs in the country.

We look forward to renewing friendships with the VADA club members who hosted us in preparations for the World Youth Cup in 2011.

On the 10th October we fly into Barcelona for the last couple of days' preparation before the Under 23 World Championships begin.




