Training has been stepped up with the inclusion of Tuesday night shooting sessions at Sturt Gym until we leave next month. The final training camp is on September 21st and 22nd where the players will have their last training game before we leave. The team really appreciates the experienced players who come out regularly to play against them at training camps, Thanks again!

The team leaves Adelaide on Wednesday 3rd October at 11.40am (check with Ali for a time to say goodbye at the airport!) flying to Amsterdam, where we spend a week preparing and acclimatising with our host club KV Wageningen.

KV Wageningen is the formation out of the merger between SKV, VADA and SSS clubs. With about 600 members, 26 youth teams and 12 senior teams KV Wageningen belongs in the top 10 largest korfball clubs in The Netherlands. During our stay at KV Wageningen the team will play 4 matches and train daily. The players will be billeted out with host families and given a bicycle to get to and from korfball.

We look forward to renewing friendships with the VADA club members who hosted us in preparations for the World Youth Cup in 2011

On the 10th October we fly into Barcelona for the last couple of days preparation before the Under 23 World Championships begin.

KEEPING YOUR HEAD STRAIGHT

A stress response is a healthier alternative than a stress reaction. A stress reaction happens automatically. It can trigger a lot of feelings and behaviours that make what could have been a simple problem into something worse. It stops us from thinking and expressing ourselves clearly. You do not have to have the stress reaction of panic or helplessness every time you are stressed. By knowing yourself, you can have a stress response. You can choose how to act and feel about a given situation, whether it's a lower study grade than you expected or a disappointing game. Congratulate yourself on having more than one way to deal with stress!


