#### **BRILLIANT IDEAS!!**

Here's a good idea for new competitions development from Hong Kong korfball. There, the young league has devised a points system where top level players (e.g. University students) are allotted high points down to new players just a single point. Teams then have a limited number of combined player points they are allowed in any oncourt team. This encourages teams to spread top players across teams and include lower pointed players and to get new players (e.g. high school students). This helps the expansion of their teams and/or clubs in the early stages of development of a league.




