G'day everyone back home, Robbo here. A lot has happened since the last edition. Including Ahoy Queens Night, Liberation Day, our first visitors and Patty and I have finally hit the field for our first few games with DVO

We had a great time having them around including a day trip out to Den Hague and Ali, Ash and Rove having a shopping day in Arnhem while Mitch hung out with Patty and me in Wageningen. Ali, Mitch and Ash also did some travel of their own. They caught the train to Bruges for 2 nights and spent a week in Paris which sounded amazing.

We were also lucky enough to go to Ahoy for the Dutch Korfball League Final. 


