COACHES

There has been a lot of interest outside of korfball in gender equity in sport from gender equity in pay of athletes to media coverage to actual mixed sport being a possibility in future Olympics. Our sport of korfball can be a leader in recognising whether or not it is a possibility or better still that it actually works. For example, if we look at the very latest developments at the highest level of our sport you see that there has been a movement away from a strategy with male players leading role in rebounding and long shots to female in

feeding the ball and taking more close range shots to one where everyone is expected to feed, rebound and shoot. Of course there will be other factors that dictate a player's main role such as a very tall player taking more of a rebounding position in attack.

However in our coaching it is worth considering gender equity in regards to expectations in play which includes expecting that all players can take on the various roles. Some questions we need to ask ourselves:

As a player am I able to take on any role in play?

As a coach do I expect male and female to take on any role?

Do we train to achieve this?

If we are not achieving equity what do we need to do about it?



REFEREES

With the focus in this issue of gender equity and gender relations issue we might also look

at this as it relates to referees. Looking at the numbers in Australia we find this:-

Referee Level	Male	Female
International	50%	50%
Level 2	75%	25%
Level 1	80%	20%
Trainee	50%	50%

We can of course come up with a large number of reasons why there is not equity in numbers but what we need to do is look at what we need to do to addresses the imbalance and we would like your ideas.

In thinking about this we might consider questions such as:

What would attract females to want to become referees?

What attracts males to become referees?

Is there a difference between male and female refereeing?

Is it an issue?

When players become referees there is the issue of attitude towards being observed and assessed. Out international referees Megan and Luke regularly ask for assessments of their games in order to try to improve their performance. If the ones at the top are always aware they can improve us" lower down" should be thinking the same way. Or, maybe there is something that stands in the way of us doing this. This may be something to consider in future months.
